The STAR method is a structured approach used to answer behavioral interview questions, where you're asked to describe how you've handled specific situations in the past. STAR stands for:

1. Situation: Set the context by describing the background or context of the situation you were in.
2. Task: Explain the task you had to complete or the challenge you faced.
3. Action: Describe the actions you took to address the task or challenge.
4. Result: Highlight the outcomes or results of your actions, ideally with measurable success or positive impact.

Using the STAR method helps, you provide clear, concise, and focused answers, making it easier for interviewers to assess your qualifications. It is particularly useful for demonstrating you're problem-solving, teamwork, leadership, and other skills.
