This year, the theme focused on "Gender Equality in Digital Transformation", as resolved by the ITU Council 2023 (Resolution 1416). The celebration aligned with one of the ITU's strategic goals – Sustainable Digital Transformation, which emphasizes equitable and inclusive use of telecommunications and ICTs to empower people and societies for sustainable development.

According to the ITU Facts and Figures 2024, an estimated 70% of men and 65% of women globally use the Internet. Despite a global shift towards gender parity, a significant gender gap remains, particularly in least developed countries, with 189 million more men than women using the Internet. Bridging the gender, geographic, and economic divides remains a major challenge in ensuring equitable access to ICTs. Achieving gender equality in the ICT sector is essential for inclusive digital progress.

The year 2025 also marks the 30th anniversary of the Beijing Platform for Action, presenting a critical opportunity to accelerate efforts through the Beijing+30 Action Agenda, which outlines concrete steps to bridge the digital gender gap and promote gender equality in technology.



The event commenced with an insightful introductory address by Er. Samir Kothari, Chairman, who highlighted the legacy, milestones, and future vision of the Nashik Local Centre.
